



Under a decade ago, Amanda Gorman was still a

In the Ashanti origin story, Kente cloth is said to be traced back to two farmers from the Bonwire Village, named Krugu Amoaya and Watah Kraban. According to the legend, the men were hunting when they encountered a brilliantly patterned spider web spun by Ananse, a trickster spider from West African lore. Ananse agreed to demonstrate the weaving technique to the farmers in exchange for some favors, and the two men shared their impressive

Here are a few colors commonly found in kente cloth, and their meaning, per Sankofa Edition and Adinkra Brand.

- black: spiritual strength, maturity, mourning and funeral rites
- red: blood, death, political passion, strength
- blue: peace, love, unity, and harmony
- gold or yellow: wealth, royalty
- green: growth, harvest, renewal
- · white: purity, cleansing rites, festive occasions
- purple or maroon: Mother Earth, healing, protection from evil

Kente is considered to be the most famous of all African textiles, and one of the world's most complicated weavings. This cloth is special as it is worn as a piece of clothing and each pattern design and each color has a name and a special meaning.

To make a magnificent Kente cloth the artist hand weaves a varn on a narrow horizontal loom. The artist will make strips of cloth that are about 3-5 inches wide and about 5-6 feet long. Customarily only men are allowed to weave the cloth. Women, on the other hand, sew strips of the cloth together to form glorious garments.

Quilt Discovery Experience

Eight Pointed Star

Stars are probably the most common motif used on quilts. Homesteaders traveling West used the stars for guidance; and they looked upon stars as religious symbols of their faith in God.

There are hundreds of star patterns. Some quilts have just one large radiating star, often called the Star of Bethlehem or Blazing Star, while in other quilts, dozens of smaller stars are used.



The simplest and most popular star pattern is an eight-pointed star.

A star pattern is not an easy design to cut or sew. Precision is extremely important as any inaccuracy in cutting or piecing is multiplied as pieces are added. If poorly pieced, the quilt will not lie flat when finished.

An intricate star pattern was one way for a woman to show her needlework skills.

Many times the quilt maker deliberately sewed a mistake somewhere in the quilt. It is thought, by some, that this reflected the maker's faith in God; for only God can make a perfect thing.

Flying geese are common units in many different quilt patterns. While there are several different methods for making them, learn how to make them faster by making four flying geese at a time- Toby Lischko shows you how.

Flying Geese Quilt Block Toby begins by talking about how a flying geese quilt block is made. If you break it down into parts, a flying geese is made from two half square triangles and one quarter square triangle. You can either make the flying geese unit by cutting those triangles, making it from one rectangle and two squares, or by using Toby's fast flying geese method, which has you cut one larger square and four smaller squares. She explains that patterns will generally give you cutting instructions for the size of pieces you will need, depending on the method used in the pattern. However, if a pattern gives you cutting instructions for a different method and you are wanting to make four flying geese at a time, like shown in this tutorial, Toby shares the mathematical formula for how to figure out what size pieces you will need.

A T-shirt quilt is a personal, custom project based on items you already own each finished guilt will be uniquely yours – and each will have its own look and flavor. Take some time to plan out a design for your guilt. Think about layout and how you want your shirts to look. Do you prefer a uniform look with square blocks that are all the same size or do you want to fussy cut each T-shirt to perfectly highlight the design portion, and then put your quilt together like a puzzle? It may be helpful to fold the Tshirts and lay them out on the ground to get an idea of which type of layout you prefer.



Suggested Standard Quilt Sizes for Beds

Our suggested quilt size dimensions are based in most cases on a mattress depth of 15". No extra length is included for a pillow tuck. Quilting, if moderate to heavy, may reduce the finished size of your quilt by 1" to 3" or more and should be considered when planning the finished size of your

quilt.



To figure ideal quilt size for a specific bed (covering mattress top, sides, and foot):

Measure mattress width (W), length (L), and depth or thickness (D).



For example: Mattress width of 60", length of 80", depth of 12"

60" + 2x12" = 84" ideal quilt width 80" + 12" = 92" ideal quilt length Quilt pattern should ideally finish at 84" x 92" for this bed.

Add more for pillow tuck (add 10" to ideal quilt length), heavy quilting, longer desired drops, etc.



Saskatchewan has developed a COVID-19 Vaccine Delivery Plan. Saskatchewan is working closely with the Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) which negotiates and procures vaccine directly with manufacturers on behalf of provinces and territories.

COVID-19 Vaccine Questions and Answers

How does the vaccine protect against COVID-19?

mRNA vaccines teach our cells how to make a protein that will trigger an immune response without using the live virus that causes COVID-19. Once triggered, our body then makes antibodies. These antibodies help us fight the infection if the real virus does enter our body in the future. The vaccine is given as a needle in the upper arm. The Pfizer and Moderna vaccines will require two doses.

It has been about four years since I gave away 90% of my belongings. Finding out about minimalism at 21 was an almost out-of-body giddy moment, convinced that this has to be one of the recipes to happiness. In 2019, still addicted to that same lightness, I started looking for ways to push it further. Having already simplified my life to only the objects that add value, I now had to figure out the best way of bringing those recurring items into my life.

I wanted to see if it was even possible to personally stop supporting consumerism for a year. *I* wanted to try buying nothing new for a full year; not so much to analyze what objects I was bringing into my life, but rather who I was supporting monetarily with my daily existence. I wanted to know if I could even step out of a system that makes it a fight to find a company that is manufactured ethically & sustainably sourced & vegan & not green washing — only to then find out they were secretly bought out by Procter & Gamble.

The working theory was that if I only acquire objects that people have already purchased but no longer want for whatever reason (the shampoo didn't work on their hair type, they bought the wrong size, they are decluttering, etc) then I am getting around giving any money to these corporations at the same time that I am saving an item from being wasted. The motivation was never about saving money, but due to this experiment I ended up saving around 3100\$ CAD.
