Modern Slice and Insert Workshop October 5, 2019


Break the rules, Express your creativity, be improvisational, play with color and simplicity and have fun! It's a 'quilting bee's day.


NEW LIBRARY COMMITTEE MEMBERS and BOOK SALE!

How did you become a quilter?

My Mother and Grandmother were quilters. However, I did not begin quilting until 2004. A group of 5 ladies used to get together weekly in one of the ladies' homes. They invited me to join them. The other ladies all moved away from Regina by 2007. So I put down quilting until January 2017, when a friend invited me to join Connecting Threads.

How would you describe your quilting style?

My style is very basic, with simple patterns. Though this year I did venture out and tried sewing circles, paper piecing, and mitering. Looking further to taking further classes to learn even more.

What is your best quilting tip?

I have learned some very neat tricks and tips from the ladies at Connecting Threads and the couple workshops that I have taken. For sewing straight(er) lines, my favourite trick is using painter's tape to pre-mark my quilt.

What do you do with the quilts you make?

Thus far, most of my quilts have gone to Connecting Threads. I did make half a dozen to give to my four grandchildren and one went to a sister and sister-in-law. I have kept 3 for my own personal use

What is the best part of the quilt guild meetings?

At the Quilt Guild meetings, I enjoy the Trunk Shows; show & share and evenings when we have "Round Robins" to learn new skills in quilting.

Hard to believe that the summer has flown by so fast! Now that Labour Day has come and gone many guilds will be starting a new year of activities. CQA/ACC wants to inform you of a few items that may be of interest to our member guilds.

CQA/ACC 2020 Member Guild Challenge -

"Gateway to Adventure"

We encourage all our member guilds to take up this challenge. As in last year's challenge, ask your guild members to create a quilt and then the guild decides which entry will represent their guild at Quilt Canada 2020 in Edmonton, Alberta. This year all entries must use the Kona, solid colour cotton, named "Jungle," which is a lovely, rich green. Last year 44 guilds participated, let's see if we can't beat that record. Go to the website here to get all the details. New this year – we will have an online entry form for this challenge, so check it out and join the adventure!





2020 Guild Rosette Invitational – The entry guidelines for the 2020 version of this popular show are now posted on our website here . The entry form link will be found on this page as of January 28, 2020 at noon EST.

Entry is limited to the first 25 eligible quilts due to space constraints. We will put notices in the monthly enewsletter and in social media once the entry form has opened to accept entries.

Please ensure that the winner of the guild rosette has their information and picture submitted for the Rosette Winners gallery page on our website prior to January 1, 2020 in order to be eligible to enter. The submission information will be sent with the email that confirms your request for a rosette.

20/20 Endless Visions Quilt Show **Quilt Categories**



S-1: Max perimeter 160". Hand or machine guilted.

M-2: Hand Quilted or Hand Applique. Made and hand guilted and/or hand appliqued by you. Max perimeter 280".

M-3: Self-machine quilted. Max perimeter 280". Made and guilted by you on any size machine. Stipulate whether using long arm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

M-4: Machine quilted by someone else. Max perimeter 280". Stipulate whether using long arm, sitdown machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

M-5: Kit, Workshop or Hand Applique. Max perimeter 280". Stipulate who guilted it and whether using long arm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

L-6: Hand Quilted or Hand Applique. Made and hand guilted and/or hand appliqued by you. More than 280" perimeter.

L-7: Self-machine quilted. More than 280" perimeter. Made and quilted by you on any size machine. Stipulate whether using long arm, sit-down machine, pantograph, computerized program, and/or stitch regulator.

L-8: Machine guilted by someone else. More than 280" perimeter. Stipulate whether using long arm, sitdown machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

L-9: Kit, Workshop, or Store Sample. More than 280" perimeter. Stipulate who quilted it and whether using long arm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

L-10: Innovative Quilt. Maximum perimeter 280". Enter the brave new world of art guilts. Show us your original creation, using a variety of materials, not from a pattern or kit. Three dimensional elements such as fabric folding or embellishments are applicable. Be sure to list all of the interesting materials you used.

11: New Generation Quilters. For quilters 16 years of age or younger, this is for you. Quilt of any size using any technique.

12: Group Quilt: Completed by 3 or more people, any size. What have you and your quilting friends stitched up lately?

13: **Recycled.** Give recycled fabrics or material a second life, any size. 50% of the top must be from recycled fabric or material. Tell us what you started with. No 3 dimensional elements or garments.

14: Modern Quilt. Max 240" perimeter. Modern bed or wall guilts depict modern design and demonstrate personal expression and originality in the design, colour and/or techniques. Minimalism, asymmetry, expansive negative space, and alternate grid work are often a part of modern guilt compositions, as are improvisational piecing and solid fabrics. (Taken from CQA National Juried Show) Stipulate who guilted it and whether using long arm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

15: Modern Quilt. More than 280" perimeter. Modern quilt as described in 14. Stipulate who quilted it and whether using long arm, sit-down machine, computerized program, pantograph, and/or stitch regulator.

16: Assorted Quilted Items. tablecloths, placemats, runners, bowls & boxes, bags, cushions etc.

Before borders is 48 x 60 after borders 54 x 66

This is an intermediate quilt pattern that is designed to practice your points and matching skills For the body you need a background and 2 distinct colors. You can use two different fabrics or light to dark variety of the same color. Example if blue and red use: Light med and dark blue and light med and dark red. You can use up to 4 fabrics of each color. Pair up your different colors (red and blue) and label A, B, C and D

Fabric is marked as such Fabric 1A, 1B, 1C, and 1D

Fabric 2A, 2B, 2C, and 2D place a swatch of fabric in squares Background fabric swatch called B

2A	2B	2C	2D

Remember you can use two fabrics instead of 8




Using your own method make 8 half square tringles blocks with Fabric 1 D and 2 D and trim to 6 %' Saw background 3 %' sg. to fabric 1D and 1C. Sew background 3 ½ x 6 ½' rectangles on top Using the following diagram sew the 4-6 1/2' sq. together to make one block.


Fabric Requirement for 4 blocks

Background 4-3 ½" x 6 ½" 12-3 ½" sq. Fabric 1C 4-7 ¼" sq. 4-3 ½" sq. Fabric 1B 4-3 ½" sq. Fabric 2D 4-3 ½" sq. Fabric 2C 4 – 7 ¼" sq.

Sewing Instructions

Using your own method make 8 half square tringle blocks with Fabric 1C and 2C and trim to 6 ½" Sew background 3 ½" sq. to fabric 1B. Sew background 3 ½ x 6 ½" rectangles on top. Make a 4 patch with background fabric, 2D and 1C.

Using the following diagram sew the 4-6 1/2" sq. together to make one block.

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
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FIBONACCI QUILTING

LAST quilt year we had a presentation about using proportion in our quilting based on Fibonacci numbers.

The following exlanation is taken from Carole Lyles Shaw website:

FIBONACCI NUMBERS SERIES

So, who was Fibonacci and what are Fibonacci numbers? This number series was introduced to Western scholars by the Italian mathematician Leonardo of Pisa, known as Fibonacci. The formula looks very complicated, but here's how it works. Fibonacci numbers are very simple. It is a series of numbers in which each number is created as the sum of the two preceding numbers.


